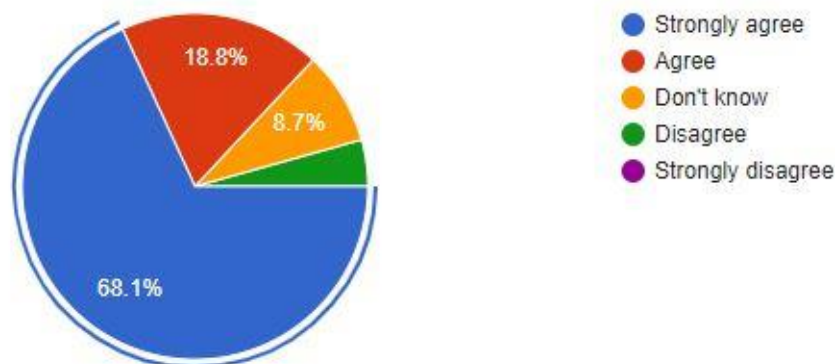


# Whole School Parent Survey October 2022

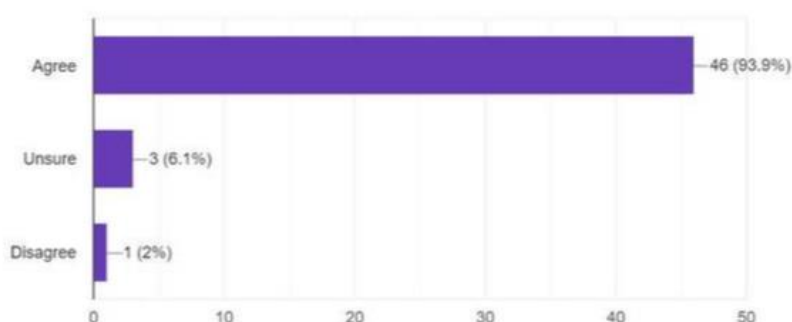

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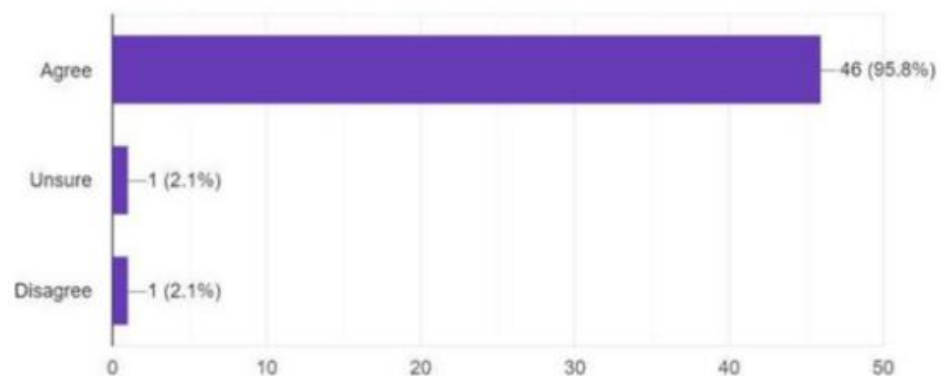

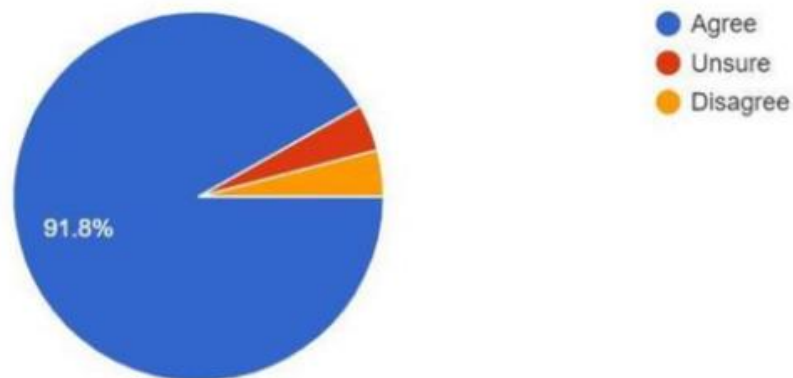
Keeping your child safe is our priority.

We have a range of effective systems & procedures to ensure that we are a safe school – for example our safeguarding measures, site security, anti-bullying and behaviour policies. We have effective internet filtering systems, and we teach the children about staying safe online. Our

safeguarding governor meets regularly with our Headteacher to make sure we are working effectively. Our Family Support Worker, Mrs Doherty provides support to children and families who need a little extra help. She works in conjunction with our school counsellor, Mrs Fellingham to provide counselling services within school, for children to enhance our nurturing & anti-bullying approaches. We also promote positive relationships through the Gospel Virtues and mutual respect. One of our three school rules is 'Be safe', we ensure all children and staff understand what this means at St. Alban's.

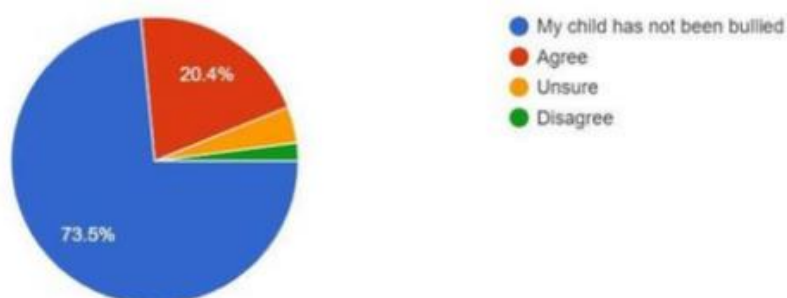
We have high expectations for good behaviour - all children are clear as to what those expectations are. Our 'School Rules' are promoted & discussed in every classroom.

- Be Ready
- Be Respectful
- Be Safe

We have clear systems in place to reward good behaviour and deal effectively and consistently with any inappropriate behaviour. We place strong emphasis on mutual respect and 'Following in the footsteps of Jesus'. We remind children of the Gospel Virtues and pupils who show they are following these virtues are rewarded weekly. There are a range of 'rewards' and 'consequences'. All children are encouraged to earn house points and work towards class rewards. Amazing work or behaviour is rewarded in our weekly celebration assembly. It is our hope all children will receive a certificate by the end of the year.

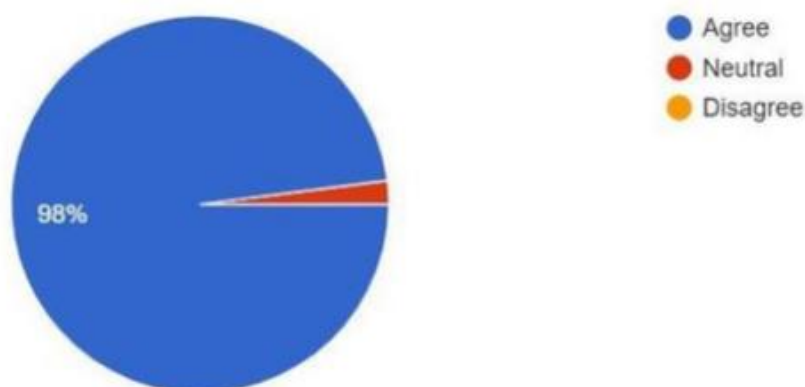
At St Alban's Catholic Primary School, we follow an evidenced based Anti-Bullying programme called KiVa to prevent and reduce bullying. It is a programme developed at the University of Turku, Finland. The main goals are:

- To prevent new bullying cases from emerging
- To tackle bullying cases effectively
- To minimise negative effects caused by bullying
- To ensure pupils express their own understanding that they are valued and cared for as unique persons, made in the image and likeness of God. They are happy, confident and feel secure.

St Alban's regards bullying of any kind as an unacceptable form of behaviour and it will not be tolerated. If we discover that an act of bullying or intimidation has taken place, we act immediately to stop any further occurrences of such behaviour. While it is very difficult to eradicate bullying, we do everything in our power to ensure that all pupils attend school free from fear.

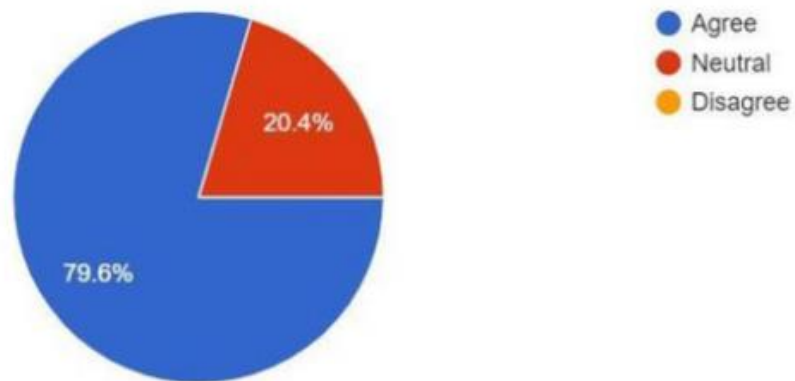
At the beginning of the academic year we invite parents in and send out curriculum overviews to ensure parents are aware of what their child is learning. Parents are invited in to workshops throughout the year to support their knowledge of what their child is learning in RE, English, Maths and to keep them safe online.

Knowledge organisers for Science, History, Geography and Art are sent out to pupils and parents half termly to support pupils retrieval practice.

The class pages on the school website offer great detail about what the children are learning across the curriculum.

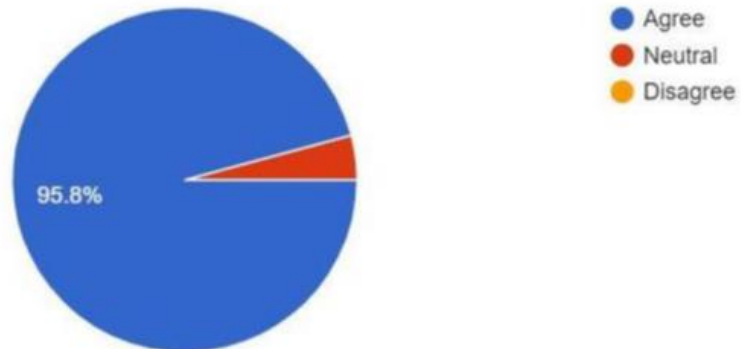

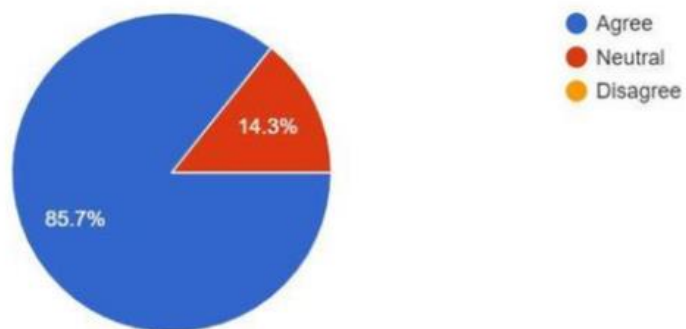
There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.

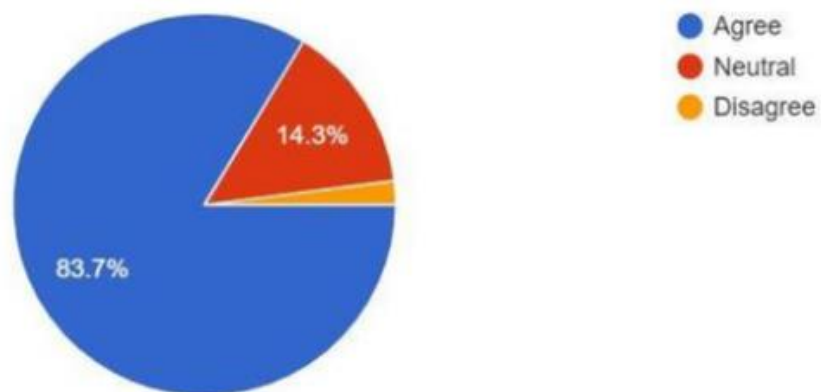
